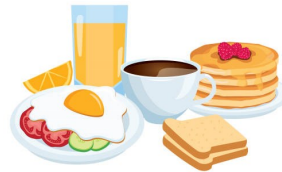

FROM THE PREACHER'S DESK

It might seem weird to already be thinking about Vacation Bible School, let alone already be planning portions of it, but the more time we have the better. For those who have helped with VBS in the past, you know how time-consuming it can be, and that's before a single child has walked through our doors. Even though it does take a lot of time and effort to put a good VBS together, the benefit always outweighs every long day and tired night. Vacation Bible School is an evangelistic effort that can lay foundations and change the lives of families for generations. I think about every VBS that I've been a part of and while they were different in terms of quality and theme; they all had one thing in common; we taught kids about Jesus. The look on those kids' faces when they come into the building and see our decorations, when they sing silly songs when they do their craft, and most importantly learn about God is why we do it. The reason we are starting this process in January when VBS isn't for another four and half months is because we want to make it the best we can. But that also means we need your help.

This past Sunday we had our first Vacation Bible School planning meeting, and I am so thankful for all those that came to be a part of it. If you couldn't make it, no worries, we will have more in the future and would love for you to join us. This meeting was to begin discussing our theme. I have listed those below with ideas for what the lessons might look like. What we need from you is to take a look at this list and cast your vote on which you'd like to help with. Notice how I worded that last sentence. While everyone is invited and encouraged to have a voice on our 2024 VBS theme, I want you to be excited about your choice because you can see yourself helping in some way. There are several things we need to do before, during, and after Vacation Bible School, and want to encourage you to plug in. Each kid that visits will go to Bible class, do an outdoor activity, and a craft, and enjoy some snacks; and we need volunteers across the board! And if you can't help during the week, we have plenty before it all begins. We'll need help painting, building, and decorating the foyer, auditorium, hallway, and

classrooms. So, don't be shocked if after you vote I ask you where you'd like to see yourself as the months go forward.

Beginning Wednesday, January 31st on our website there will be a link where you can vote on two very important decisions. Our 2024 theme, as well as whether you'd like to do it in the morning or the evening. In the end, it doesn't matter, so long as our focus is on sharing God's Word with the kids that come.

Theme ideas:

"Mission Deep Sea" – focusing on those stories in scripture around water: Jonah, Red Sea, etc.

"Set Sail: Amazing Bible Adventures" – focusing on the fruit of the spirit, gifts of God, etc.

"Expedition Egypt" – focuses on the life of Moses from birth to the Red Sea and then Christ.

"Into the Jungle" – focusing on wilderness moments in scripture: Garden of Eden, Daniel, etc.

"Camp Out: Learning S'more About Jesus" – focusing on the Bible as our compass and guide

"Wild West" – Focusing on overcoming the dangers of the world.

The theme titles and lesson subjects might change a bit by the end, but the spirit and idea of each of these themes will remain the same. A complete curriculum and teacher script will be provided for whatever theme is selected. If you have any questions don't hesitate to ask. The voting will be up on our website beginning tomorrow and last for one week. If you don't want to use the website we will have paper copies available Wednesday evening. We only ask that you turn them in to the office by the following Wednesday. We will only accept one vote from each person, so no need to do both the website and the paper option; we are requesting you put your name on the ballot, so we have a record of who has voted and who hasn't; and to help us create a list of potential volunteers.
