From the Preacher's Desk

This past Lord's Day, I began a new series on Bible Geography. Most people when they hear that topic immediately assume it's going to be boring, and if that's how you feel, I get it. This is a subject that I have wanted to teach for quite some time but struggled with how to put it together. The biggest hurdle that I faced was taking something that most assume is going to be dull and overflowing with facts and making it something exciting. I don't try and make my lessons exciting for entertainment purposes, in almost all instances I preach the truth and my natural passion makes up for hard-to-swallow lessons. However, Bible Geography is one subject that I want to make exciting, not because most think it's boring, but because it's a different way to study God's Word that makes it come to life. If you were not able to join us for our first lesson we have more introductory lessons, this coming Sunday, and then we will travel with Jesus through the Holy Land and look at some of those stories that we've known forever, but through a new lens, and watch how they take on new meanings. Thank you to all those who have encouraged me and told me how excited they are for this series. Also a big thank you to those who have shared books they've read or found on the subject. I already owe a debt of gratitude to some authors whose books have helped in my lessons, and now I have more to read on a subject that I love and hope you learn to love as well.

TRUNK-or-TREAT is right around the corner, and with that a few things we are going to need. First and foremost, mark your calendars for Saturday, October 28th. This will be the official day for our annual evangelistic event. While we are still ironing out some details we do know with 100% certainty that it will be the Saturday in the evening.

Second, we need LOTS of candy. There will be a basket in the foyer for you to donate candy for the event, or if you'd prefer, you can donate money and we will purchase the candy for you. I always make a trip to Sam's Club and get as much bulk candy as we can. Our goal every year is to have about two shopping carts full of candy. While that seems like a lot, I can promise you that we go through it quickly.

Lastly, we need as many participants as we can get. This year I'd like to see 25 cars set up and ready to go for this event. We are debating on having a more traditional "walk-thru" Trunk-or-Treat as opposed to the "drive-thru" ones we've had in the past. There are two major reasons for this change. 1. We want to give ourselves more time to talk with members of the community. When they are in their vehicles, it's difficult to get to chat with people, and that's one of the major reasons we do this. 2. If we adopt a "walk-thru" only event, it allows for our members and volunteers to be more relaxed. You can sit by your vehicle, even set up a carnival-style game, and let the people come to you.

This is one of my favorite events each year, and this congregation does a fantastic job of making it a huge success. So please save the date, donate some candy, and sign up for a spot in our parking lot. If you need help decorating, I'd be more than happy to provide everything.

I just wanted to remind this congregation how much my family loves each of you! Thank you for all the sacrifice that is made by the members here, most of which goes unnoticed and underappreciated. Thank you for helping the Kingdom here in Angleton grow each day. I look forward to the rest of this year, and the many years to come. God bless and have a great week!
